

SECRETARY'S MESSAGE

I'm sure that you have found the bulletin to be alittle early in arriving. Charles Reko, tries to have the bulletin in the mail by the 22nd usually, but like I said, this one will be just a bit early.

If any of you write to me and don't receive a reply for some time I will be out of the state for awhile. My plans are to be in Los Angles on Oct. 28, to Hawaii on Nov. 1 thru 12th and back to Texas on Nov. 15th. I regret that I will not be able to attend the coming Convention in November as it is too late for me and my work, but I wish you and all the members the best of luck at this convention.

Maurice as a member of our Foreign Relations Committee has reported that he has heard from one of the French rabbit magazines he has subscribed to and has the following to report:

In the French magazine "La Revue Avicole" an article which might interest you. The title of the article is: Corrections of the Standards for different breeds". Those corrections are accepted for the Blanc de Hotot, I read:

- a) a small patch of black hairs around the ears in considered as a small defect
- b) more than one patch of black hairs around the ears is a disqualification.

Members, to date I have only noticed these black hairs in one of our Hotots, an imported senior buck. However, I might mention to each of you that if an Hotot become cut or nicked anywhere on the body that is white, the hairs nine times out of ten will come back black. All the more reason to be careful in handling your stock.

Maurice will be reporting any information that he might read in the French rabbit magazines, and of course I will be reporting it to the membership through our bulletin.

I received a couple of remarks concerning our membership cards, I was however dissapointed that more of the members did not reply.

"I think the new membership card is terrific. Of those membership cards that I hold, this is one of the best. Keep up the good work."


"I think the cards are very nice. I especially liked the picture of the Hotot rabbit on the card. Thank you"


With our membership still being quite small, I thought surely we would have a 100% voter turn out, but I was sadly mistaken to find that a third of our membership didn't vote.



you a speedy recovery.

The members of the Constitution and Resolutions Committee of the Hotot Rabbit Breeders International have been chosen to make the necessary changes, additions and delections in our Constitution & By-Laws, so that they conform to the rules and regulations set by the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. After carefully going over the entire Constitution and By-Laws of this organization, the following is offered for the memberships approval. To not take up too much of your time and to help you better understand our suggestions, we have only listed the rewordings and the additions. We ask that you take your copy of the present Constitution and By-Laws to follow along. With these changes, we feel that our regulations and rules will stand the test of time.

As a member, please carefully study and evaluate all items that have been mentioned. After all our Constitution and By-Laws is the true foundation of this organization, and too, are the rules that each of us, as members, must live by.



PROPOSED AMMENDMENTS

CONSTITUTION

- 1) ARTICLE III to read as follows:
 This organization shall be affiliated with the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. Any Local or State Specialty group whose policies are in accord with those of this organization may be granted a letter of approval by this organization, subject to the approval of the Executive Committee for Charter in the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. Approval request must be accompanied by the groups Constitution and By-Laws, and a roster of the organization's officers and membership. All officers and members of affiliated groups must be ARBA members and members of this organization before approval will be granted.
- 2) ARTICLE V, SECTION 3 to read as follows:
 The office of Secretary-Treasurer shall be elected by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote by the Executive Committee. Failure to perform the duties as required by the Constitution and By-Laws and by the Executive Committee may constitute grounds for removal.
- 3) ARTICLE V, SECTION 5 last sentence to read as follows: The election of the Secretary-Treasurer shall be made on even years by the Executive Committee.
- 4) DUTIES OF OFFICERS first sentence to read as follows:
 The President shall preside at all meetings of this organization,
 and act as Chairman of the Executive Committee.
 (NOTE: the part,"with full power and prerogatives"has been omited
 for the reason that if a tie had to be broken the President would
 then have the power to vote in order that a tie be broken.)

PROPOSED AMMENDMENTS

BY-LAWS

- An "E. Bernhard Memorial Member of the Year"shall be chosen yearly. Nominations shall be made to the Secretary prior to July 31, for any member whose services and/or achievements merit such an award. The Executive Committee shall review each nominee's services and/or achievements and shall so elect a "Member of the Year". Award to be presented at the Annual General Meeting. Plaque bearing the winner's name shall be kept in this organization's office, with token award presented to winner. Resume of winner's services and/or achievements to be published in the official publication. A member shall be eligible to win only once.
- 6) (NOTE: at the end of ARTICLE II, SECTION 6, ARTICLE III to be VOTING PROCEDURE and not DEPARTMENTS AND COMMITTEES. We propose that all ARTICLES to be raised one in number.) ARTICLE III SECTION 1 to read as follows: (Please see next page)

6) SECTION 1

Any member in good standing of the Hotot Rabbit Breeders International, wishing to become a candidate for any elective office of this organization, shall write the Secretary for a nominating The nominating petition shall carry the member's name petition. and the office he/she decides to be a candidate for and shall carry the signatures of five (5) members of the Hotot Rabbit Breeders International in good standing. When the petition is filed, before August 1st, with the Secretary, the Secretary shall then place the member's name who appears on the petition on the election ballot. These election ballots shall be mailed out and returned to the Election Committee. After the final count is in, the Election Committee shall advise the Secretary as to their findings and the highest for each office shall be declared duly elected.

SECTION 2. Candidates for Director shall be grouped by districts and only members for the particular district shall be allowed to vote for their Director.

SECTION 3. Candidates for President and Vice-President shall be elected from the general membership.

SECTION 4. A self-addressed envelope shall accompany each ballot addressed to the Chairman of the Election Committee and party voting shall seal same and mail direct to the Election Committee Chairman. Committee shall then count ballots ten (10) days after closing of the polls and send either certified mail or hand deliver the results to the Secretary. When ballots are counted, they shall be sealed and forwarded to the Secretary, and shall be retained in the organization's file.

SECTION 5. No member of the Election Committee can be nominated for an elective office.

SECTION 6. The Election Committee shall be composed of a Chairman and two (2) committee members, all of whom must be members in good standing of this organization.

7) At the end of ARTICLE IV, DEPARTMENTS AND COMMITTEES is to be ARTICLE V, DISCIPLINE and to read as follows:

SECTION 1. Charges of misconduct may be filed by any member against any other member. They must be in writing and filed with the Secretary-Treasurer along with a \$10.00 fee.

SECTION 2. Any member against whom charges have been filed shall be furnished a complete statement of charges by the Secretary-Treasurer and shall be allowed thirty (30) days to file reply. SECTION 3. The charges together with the reply, if any has been

received, shall be furnished to each member of the Executive Committee for his/her consideration. The Executive Committee may, by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote, suspend or expel the member. Less that two-thirds (2/3) majority shall constitute acquittal of charges.

SECTION 4. Any member suspended shall not be eligible for reinstatement within one year of the date of suspension. Any member expelled shall not be eligible for membership in this organization

at any time.

SECTION 5. If acquittal of charges has been reached, filer shall not be reimbursed his/her fee. If member is suspened or expelled, fee to be returned to complainant.

LAPIN BLANC, shall be a new column in our "Pyramid of Pleasures" publication. All recipes that appear have been prepared here in my kitchen for either myself or guests and have proven to be good in the respect of no complaints. I hope you find the same when you prepare the dishes.

While LAPIN BLANC is going to be mostly catered to the ladies in our organization, the gentlemen might like to try a hand at the dishes themselves. If you can follow instructions, there is no reason why you shouldn't be able to give your wife a break from her daily kitchen chores. All recipes are easy, if they weren't I for sure wouldn't have tackled them myself.

Although many of the recipes that will be appearing bi-monthly are more or less known, some have been spiced up alittle to suit individual taste. Then again some are the creation of taking a rabbit, adding a little of this, a dash of that and a pinch of something else. It's been alot of fun at times, but then again there has been cases where alittle of too much was added. Regardless the error have been corrected, so you won't be found with anything that isn't fitting to eat.

If you have a recipe ladies or gentlemen, and would like to share it with our members, please send it in. Before publication I'll give a try at preparing it myself. If one particular chef seems to have rabbit cooking down pat, well I'll gladly turn my apron and pots over to he or she.

Since this is the first recipe for the LAPIN BLANC, we might as well take one from the region inwhich the Hotot rabbit originated If we were to visit a farm kitchen in Normandy, chances are we would find a crockful of rabbit with cider in the oven, while the farmer's wife goes about her morning chores. This particular rabbit stew, while originating with the peasantry, is a succulent dish fit for a king. This dish cooks slowly, so once it is in the oven, the cook is free.

NORMANDY RABBIT IN CIDER

1 2½ to 3 lb. rabbit (Use an Hotot, one of your culls that is)
A Seasoned Flour*
½ cup vegetable oil
12 button mushrooms
½ tsp. chervil
3/4 tsp. chopped chives
1½ cups apple cider (juice may be used)
Salt and freshley ground pepper to taste

For best results in preparing the Normandy Rabbit In Cider Lit is best to use a Roman Pot, however a casserole dish will give very near the same results.

Cut the rabbit into serving peices, dredge with seasoned flour. Heat oil in a heavy skillet (large). Add the rabbit and cook over a medium high heat until well browned on all sides. Place rabbit in Roman pot and add the mushrooms, chives and chervil. Pouring off all except 2 tablespoons of drippings from the skillet, add 1 tablespoon of the seasoned flour to the drippings in skillet and cook, stirring constantly, (if you don't your kitchen will be a smoke up, smelly mess) until golden brown. Add cider and 1/2 cup water gradually, stirring constantly once again, and bring to a boil. Pour over the rabbit mixture and season with salt and pepper, if your taste buds desire. Cover and seal (Roman pots must be sealed). Bake in a preheated oven at 350 degrees for 1 1/2 hours. Break the seal if Roman pot is used and remove cover.

This particular recipe makes about 6 servings, that is, if your not starved to death from the smell of the rabbit cooking. I had better say the recipe makes 4 servings, as I'm sure you'll be eating more than your share.

* Seasoned Flour

4 cups all-purpose flour
2 TBSP freshly ground pepper
1 TBSP paprika
1 tsp chervil
1 tsp parsley flakes
1/4 cup salt
2 TBSP dry English mustard
1 tsp basil
1 tsp thyme

Sift flour, salt, pepper, mustard and paprika together. Stir in the herbs and store in an airtight container for use as needed. Recipe makes about $4\frac{1}{2}$ cups of seasoned flour.

For those who try the Normandy Rabbit In Cider, I would appreciate your comments. Bob






