

FROM OUR PRESIDENT . . .

Hello from Wisconsin!

For starters, I would like to apologize for not being on top of club business this year. I have been going through some serious family issues this whole year but it is time to move forward. With JJ's and Stacey's help, I am going to get this club back on track.

There is some major business that needs to be taken care of ASAP. The first is elections. The club needs energetic individuals to step up help steer the club into the future. Elections this year are for vice president and 5 directors: Districts 1, 3, 5, 7, and 9. Stacey should have what states make up the districts listed elsewhere in the newsletter. And we don't have members in every district so you can be a director for a district you don't live in. Think about what you could do to promote the club and Blanc de Hotot!

Another major item that needs to be taken care of is 2019 Spring Nationals. 2018 has been awarded to Amana, Iowa for April 21 and 22 but we still have no bids for 2019. Local shows are a good option too. They can be much cheaper for a small club like ours that doesn't typically have that many shown. If you are interested, please let know and I can help you with submitting a bid and what will need to be done for the show. The constitution requires at least 2 bids, so please think about and submit a bid for your area.

rabbits for a week and no one thinks you're crazy (except for some people at the hotel, but what do they know). We do have a booth this year so please stop by and chat. I have submitted the paperwork for a raffle and hopefully it will go through no problem. If we can't have a raffle, we will still have a silent auction. Please submit items for the raffle or auction. This will help pay for the booth. There will also be merchandise for sale at the booth and membership blanks for renewing your membership or signing up new members when you sell stock.

There will be a membership meeting at Convention. Stacey will post it in the newsletter. Same as last year we will be livestreaming it on Facebook. Not sure about all that high tech stuff but it went over well last year with members not at the meeting being able to ask questions that we could answer immediately. Check it out!

Finally, let's get to Stacey's topic for this newsletter. Convention advice: First let's talk about feed. Pretty much all of the major brands donate feed for convention. So if you feed a big name brand feed, no problem (although it is hard to find your feed at times). But if you feed a regional brand, you will probably want to bring some feed from home if at all possible. It is already a very stressful situation for the rabbits and a change of feed could be disastrous. Make sure you bring their regular treats too. I would also recommend bringing water from home. If you are traveling a distance and that isn't possible,

buy gallons of water at the store when you get there. It will taste more like their water at home than city water. If you live in the city, it may not make a difference but I'm a country girl and if I won't drink city water why would I expect my rabbits to. Also bring some hay with you or buy some at convention. It keeps the gut moving. If you get there and have one that won't eat, I've heard white bread is the way to go. They seem to eat that when they won't eat anything else.

Well, that seems long enough! If you are at the Indianapolis Convention, stop by and chat. And everyone please think about what YOU can do to improve the club!

FROM OUR VICE PRESIDENT . . .

Vice President's Report
September 2017

Greetings, fellow Hotot breeders!

We've had a reasonably successful year, with Hotot Nationals being held in May at WCC and starting two new breeders off with Hotot thanks to the donation of livestock from Bella's Bees Rabbitry and Mad Hatter Rabbits. One of the main purposes of the Hotot Rabbit Breeders International is to promote the breed, something that all of us can do!

What are some ideas for promoting Hotot?

What about offering stock as a prize for a contest, or just outright to ethical breeders? Blue Springs Rabbitry offered a pair of Hotot for free to anyone in Utah who was willing to take them and use them, I believe similar efforts from Bob & Cheryl's rabbitry in Washington produced an excellent Hotot youth breeder who became an ARBA judge! We've seen this technique be successful in many areas. Something we've seen successful is to approach successful and ethical breeders of other commercial breeds in your area and ask them to take on Hotot as a project for at least a year. They are bringing their knowledge of other breeds in to benefit the Hotot!

What about pricing your animals at your bargain prices? This might be a different price point for different breeders, but the entry level price point for Hotot can be a serious detriment for people interested in

the breed, particularly because many times all that is available is a sport.

What about posting about Hotot on your Facebook groups? It seems that there are regularly posts from people asking what your favorite breed is for this reason or that – this is a grand opportunity to share why the Hotot is an amazing rabbit that's worth pursuing! Just posting photos of your rabbits you take as you go about your barn work can be a way to stir interest in the breed (one breeder I know posts a photo of her rabbits on Facebook every morning with a cheerful, "Good morning!" – it's become something I enjoy seeing in my own newsfeed!)

What are your ideas for promoting Hotot?

Regardless of how you go about it, there's no doubt that our club can grow and the breed can thrive if enough people are supportive and choosing to be positive and encouraging. Thank you for your support of the HRBI and may your nest boxes be full and your litters be show marked!

DISTRICT 1 REPORT ...

Preparation for Convention

The first thing I want to address, as it leads to our personal preparations for convention, is our local show reports. We have nothing exciting or significant to report. Bella Stouffer has been the only exhibitor at the last couple of local to us

shows. The county fairs have brought no new or existing Hotot breeders, again, only Bella. She has collaborated with other breeders to find ways to get more youth interested in breeding this challenging and rare breed. There aren't a lot of youth that stick with such a challenge, they are a lesson in patience and hard work, not an instant gratification breed. I believe that getting our youth interested in the long term project of breeding and showing Hotots is essential to keeping this breed going. Our youth need to collaborate and learn from those more experienced with the breed. I hope to see long term breeders reach out to the committed youth and teach them, teach them genetics, oddities they've seen within the breed, ideas on how to improve their lines, what to do when issues arise. Teaching the youth in a positive way ensures there will be breeders long term and my hope is to see more of that.

Preparation for a youth exhibitor going to Nationals starts months to a year ahead of time. Breeding schedules need to be created to ensure stock is ready for convention, lots of breedings. I could go on for days about timing, evaluating, etc....but I'm sure many of you have already perfected that. What I want to discuss is another aspect of youth getting ready for convention. Some of our youth breeders will be competing in Royalties this year as in years past. This requires a significant amount of prep work and planning to ensure all deadlines are met months prior. If they are going to Nationals they've typically gone to their state convention and competed in Royalties there too,

qualifying for state teams, scholarships and special recognition, all of which starts months ahead of time. Here's where promoting the breed comes in and creating more interest resulting in more substantial show reports. In Royalties our youth have an opportunity to explain what they are doing to make a difference within the rabbit breeding community as well as with their breed/s they are focused on. They have the opportunity to discuss their knowledge of rare breeds and the importance of continuing to raise them to the Standard of Perfection while promoting their breed in as many ways as possible. I hear from a lot of people that Hotots have poor dispositions. I know for Bella it's important to show people the sweet and affectionate side of this breed, a trait she works hard at perpetuating within her rabbitry. She brings her Hotots to community service events, barbers, local community centers, and costume contests to name a few. Talking about promoting this breed in this way is always a great topic of conversation anywhere she goes and especially in her Royalties interviews. There's a lot of room for creating more opportunities for more youth. I have faith that will happen as more breeders see our current youth as the passionate and amazing individuals and breeders that they are.

Winterizing your Rabbitry by JJ Story-Veale

The weather is beginning to turn and before long we will be dealing with the joys of raising rabbits in the winter! Here are some things we do in our rabbitry to prepare for the colder months:

Cleaning. The drop in temperatures makes doing chores in our outdoor rabbitry much nicer! The fall is the perfect time for us to deep clean the cages, burn off the cobwebs, bleach out the nest boxes, and generally make sure the rabbitry is feeling fresh.

Water Bowls for Water Bottles. We tend to use water bottles once the temperatures stop freezing and water bowls for the winter months. The bottles are handy because they typically hold more ounces of water, but then they freeze (or the nipples freeze) as soon as the temperatures drop. Bowls make things easier for our rabbits, although we could build an "Ice fort" out of the ice blocks from emptying the dishes in the morning! Hmm... maybe I've just come up with a new idea for the kids – igloos!

Worming. We do a preventative worming of our rabbits in the fall and spring. We use grapefruit seed extract with the following application: Day 1, 7 drops per gallon of water. Day 2, 8 drops per gallon of water. Day 3, 9 drops per gallon of water. Days 4-10, 10 drops per gallon of water.

Cull. We tend to clear out the rabbitry as the weather changes because having fewer rabbits makes doing chores faster on the nasty days. Those rabbits we've been on the fence about all summer either get promoted to breeder status or a one-way ticket to freezer camp.

Prepping for ARBA Nationals

It's time for the big show! ARBA Nationals 2016 is located in Del Mar, California and we are going!

This is only our second national show to attend, so we aren't truly experts, but here are a few things we have done to prepare:

Get a Hotel Room. We originally made reservations at a hotel that was several miles from the fairgrounds, but then a few spots opened up at the host hotel so we switched! Hurray!

Purchase Show Catalog and Results book. The show catalog is full of great information about the schedule, extra meetings, rules, judges of the breeds, club information, etc. Also places to eat and stay, extra tours... lots of stuff! We also enjoy getting the Results book because there is no set schedule for breed judging and if you miss your breed you won't have a clue how everyone placed without the Results book!

Get Car in for Check Up. We are driving to Nationals and I can't think of anything worse than being broken down on the side of the road with a load of bunnies in the back! So our trusty Suburban went to the shop for a complete checkup from tires to wires and got the seal of approval.

Paperwork. Not only do we have the paperwork from our Convention entry, but also the load/unload sheet for our rabbits. We label each hole of the carriers with the rabbit who will occupy it, and then check it

off as we load. We'll do a similar situation with our return animals. At check-in you also need your ARBA membership card.



This is our pocket-sized cheat sheet for our breeds and coop numbers.

Labels. Decorations on the coops are discouraged at the Convention, but having something to identify your rabbits is really helpful in the long rows of coops! We used a free download from a teacher for labels this year and included the name of the rabbit and a contact phone number just in case anyone needed to talk to us about the rabbit. And we'll remove the labels completely when we leave, of course.

Breed. We have about two more months of reasonable weather before our temperatures are freezing for most or all of the day. We hate being on rabbit watch and staying up to check rabbits in the wee hours of the night or morning for new litters! So the fall is a great time for us to breed and get those last litters in before spring nationals or our other spring shows!

What do you do to prepare for the winter?

Obviously these shavings get messy quickly and need frequent cleaning! This year we are trying coop risers for our Blanc de Hotot to help keep them clean. This is the way to go! The rabbits stay sooo much cleaner and happier with the risers!

Water Bucket with Spout. We have found a houseplant watering can with the long spout extremely helpful. We can get the job done with a milk jug but the extra maneuvering provided by a watering can is awesome!

Pedigree Book. You never know what might come up, so I'm bringing hard copies of all of our pedigrees. One thing I'm pretty excited about for our sale rabbits is a newer program called **Hutch**. It allows you to generate a QR code for pedigrees, so if you print the QR code and put it with the rabbit anyone interested would be able to see the lines behind the rabbit right then. How lovely!

Good Attitude and Comfortable Shoes. I was stunned in Portland at how much my

feet hurt! The judging classes are large, so there is a lot of standing around as you're waiting to hear the results! By the end of the first day my back was tight and my feet were sore. By the end of day two even our 9-year-old was desperate for a place to sit! This year we are bringing our most comfortable shoes and consciously choosing to have a good attitude no matter what our circumstances.

That's our quick and dirty prep list for Nationals. I'm sure we'll have more in the future, but here are the basics!
