The rabbit community will know we have arrived and mean business in Reno!

Since a recent SCAM occurred with my club email address, I want to share ways to keep your email presence safe:

- 1. Use a strong, unique password
- 2. Use two-factor authentication
- 3. Do not forward emails very often
- 4. Logout of any public sessions you open your email over
- 5. NEVER Cc: a whole list of email addresses you are sending email to ALWAYS Bcc: which sends the email to everyone you want to, but no one sees each other's email addresses
- 6. Read emails thoroughly email may come in with a legitimate email address and use names of people that you know but the email will contain subtle misspelled words and often be grammatically incorrect

International Director will be a term of two-years.) and International Director. Please submit petition for elected office to Secretary Lisa Lang hrbiclubmembership@gmail.com by August 1st. Any member in good standing of the Hotot Rabbit Breeders International, wishing to become a candidate for any elective office of this organization, shall write the Secretary for a nominating petition. The nominating petition shall carry the members name and the office s/he decides to be a candidate for and shall carry the signatures of five (5) members in good standing of the Hotot Rabbit Breeders International. When the petition is filed before August 1st, with the Secretary, the Secretary shall then place the member's name who appears on the petition on

the election ballot. The Secretary shall then mail or transmit by email the election ballots to each member in good standing.

Proposed enange in HRBI By-Laws-

A Survey Monkey will be distributed to the HRBI Members on or about July 14, 2019 for the following:

29 June 2019 PROPOSAL to remove the entire AWARDS section from the HRBI By-Laws

Historically AWARDS are not a subject contained in the legal documentation of a Constitutions or By-laws. Awards would typically be found in a Policies and Procedures Handbook (which is under development at this time for the HRBI).

Remove from By-Laws into Policies & Procedures Handbook ARTICLE VIII AWARDS

Section 1: An "E. Bernhard memorial Member of the Year" shall be chosen yearly. Nominations shall be made to the Secretary-Treasurer prior to July 31st for any member whose services and/or achievements merit such an award. The Executive Committee shall review each nominee's services and/or achievements and shall select a "Member of the Year." Award to be presented at the Annual General Meeting. A plaque bearing the winner's name shall be kept in this organization's office with a token award presented to the winner. A resume of the winner's service(s) and/or achievement(s) will be published in the official publication.

Section 2: A "Bob D. Whitman Trophy", named after Bob D. Whitman for his significant contribution to the breed in North America, shall be presented to the Open BOB winners of the ARBA Convention and the Hotot Rabbit Breeders International National Show. Winners will engrave their own name on the trophy using Bernhard Tango font, as follows: (Year) ARBA Conv. or (Year) National First Name Last Name Winners must return the trophy and its case by mail or in person to a club member who officially commits to award the trophy at the

next national event (Blanc de Hotot National Show or ARBA Convention). In principle, winners shall keep the trophy for a minimum period of two (2) months.

Section 3: A "Mary Hughley Award", named after Mary Hughley for her significant contribution to the breed in North America, shall be presented to the Youth BOB winners of the ARBA Convention and the Blanc de Hotot National Show. Section 4: In order to receive awards from Hotot Rabbit Breeders International, exhibitors must be current members of Hotot Rabbit Breeders International or apply for a membership and pay their dues.
