terested in hearing your comments on which variety of the "Mink of The Rabbit Family" has the best finished coat and which holds that top show condition the longest before going into a moult. Many breeders also feel strongly about housing Havanas and especially Chocolate Havanas in very subdued light. I would tend to agree with this theory and your comments are welcomed.

One last area of consideration regarding the Chocolate variety. Should you breed strictly Chocolate to Chocolate or try a Black cross every so often?

I'm sure there are lots of breeders out there who have opinions on the above questions and there are just as many breeders awaiting your responses.
