National Mini Rex Rabbit Club

Springtime finds us all hoping for large healthy litters and grooming our rabbits for the many upcoming Spring shows. We should all be making our plans for our National Specialty Show in Sedalia, Missouri called 'Show Me Your Mini Rex' held over the Memorial Day weekend, May 27-28, 1995. The show will be at the Missouri State Fairgrounds, with the specialty show on Saturday judged by Walter Gibson, and Walter Wills and Don Jackson judging the youth show. On Sunday, there will be a Central States Rabbit Club Show, judging for both days will begin at 8:30 a.m. and both shows will be double sweepstakes points shows. Entry deadline will be May 12, 1995 with entry fees of \$4.00 per entry and \$2.00 fur for the NMRRC show on Saturday and \$3.00 per entry and \$2.00 fur for the CSRB show on Sunday. Entries should be sent to: Sue Gillispie, HCR 71 Box 110, Vienna, MO 65582. The Sedalia Inn will be the show hotel, with a special rate of \$37.00 per night for a double room. Phone (816) 826-8400. There will be a picnic style Barbecue on Saturday night at the fairgrounds with a price of \$6.50 for adults, \$4.50 for youth, and children 8 and under are free. Please mark on your entry form if you will be attending. You may pay for the banquet at the show. The nearest airport will be Kansas City, and the show grounds are about a two-hour drive. There will be no shipped in rabbits. Camping is available on the fairgrounds. The barns will open at 3:00 p.m. on Friday until 10:00 p.m., on Friday, and at 6:30 a.m. on Saturday and Sunday. There will be a security team in place during the day and staying overnight in the barn. If you wish to bring rabbits to sell,



cooping will be \$2.00 per rabbit. You might indicate on your entry form how many sale coops you will need. The feeds available will be Heinhold and Lipscomb. Contact General Gene Gillispie (814) 744-5882 with any further questions.

If you are thinking ahead to Louisville. you've probably already bred and are raising your winning animals. With the entry numbers growing steadily, I believe we could see 1100 to 1200 Mini Rex at the 1995 Convention, maybe more. The smoothest running judging tables are the ones with the most help in carrying up and recooping the animals. We always seem to start out with plenty of enthusiastic helpers but towards the late afternoon it is really difficult to get the rabbits carried off of the table, and the judging grinds to a halt. I would hope that this year we could organize some cooperative effort to have carriers that would work for a couple of hours and then take a break and be replaced by another group that would work for a couple of hours. I know that it isn't the most interesting or glamorous of jobs, but if you look at it as if each rabbit you are carrying is someone's pride and joy, their contender for BOR and somewhere, someone else is carrying your pride and joy and contender for BOB, it is an important job and deserves our best effort. Please talk to your fellow breeders and see if you can form a group that would give a little time to carrying rabbits.

A professional photographer took pictures of all of the varieties of Mini Rex at the Tulsa show and a full color poster is being readied for sale. I would hope that if you are a judge or have a special someone who is a judge you would get one of these posters. If the photos turn out as well as we hope, they will be a great help in defining ideal color for the breeder and judge alike. When the posters are available they will be sold at the Mini Rex booth at convention and by mail, from our storekeeper.

Elections are coming up this summer and it will be an interesting slate of contenders for president. You will find profiles of the candidates in your upcoming newsletter, please read them over carefully and be sure to vote for district directors in the even numbered districts and president. Those who are elected will have a very busy term, our club is experiencing rapid growth and constant change, with all of the accompanying joys and headaches.
